

## Mrs. J. D. Edmondson . . . Pioneer dies

Mrs. J. D. (Eldora Azalee] Edmondson, 86. a long time resident of Mullin, died Monday at 11:15 p.m. after an illness of six months, in the home of a daughter, Mrs. O. W. Crump of 1607 Ave. I. She had lived in Brownwood since January of this year.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Davis-Morris Funeral Home chapel with Ollie Cantwell, minister, officiating. Burial will be In Mount Pleasant Cemetery in San Saba County.

Mrs. Edmondson was born March 29, 1876 in Hill County and married J. D. Edmondson in February, 1899 at the home of her parents in Bandera. They moved to San Saba County, across the Colorado River from Regency, where they farmed for 23 years. In December 1925, they moved to Mullin where Mr. Edmondson was engaged in farming until his death in 1941.

She had lived In the same house they bought when they moved to Mullin until this year. She had been a member of the Church of Christ since 1909.

She is survived by five sons, Dan Edmondson of Brownwood, R.W. Edmondson of San Angelo, W. J. Edmondson of Richland Springs, Dennis Edmondson of Mullin, and Glynn Edmondson of Eldorado; five daughters, Mrs. A. R. McMullin of Waco, Mrs. W. F. Coffee of San Antonio, Mrs. C.A. Morgan of Clarendon, Mrs. Carl Greer and Mrs. Crump both of Brownwood; 28 grandchildren and 35 great-grandchildren.
